Chillesford 105A; 3 ploughs; 8 men

As we can see, Butley is now in the same league as Capel and Boyton as regards cultivated acreage and density of population. A bonus is the revelation that its sheepwalks were a resource at the time of the Survey, and even prior to 1066, for which 100 sheep are recorded. If we accept the identification of Hamo's surname, then his manor in the hitherto missing portion of Butley may have passed down in the Valognes family to Theobald, father-in-law of Ranulph de Glanville to whom it came on marriage to Bertha.

Puzzling over the alias of a mill has resulted in unexpected new information for local historians.
