for Bernaert Foncq who is recorded as working in Antwerp between 1550-78. The Low Countries and Nuremberg were centres of metalworking and exported to this country. If it were not for the maker's stamp, we could easily be misled into assuming that the weight was as much as two centuries older; it reproduces the medieval ship used by Edward III when he introduced coins of this weight in 1351.
