See *The Journal of William Dowsing* edited by Trevor Cooper, The Ecclesiological Society and Boydell Press, 2001, p 221: 'We brake down 28 superstitious pictures; <u>and took up 11 popish inscriptions in brass</u>; and gave orders for digging up the steps, and taking of 2 crosses off the steeple, one off the church, and one off the [chancel], in all four'.
- 2. Robert Pawling seems to have been a bit of a local Mr Fix-It. He served as constable of Orford and he was a popular choice as an executor. In 1539 he was selling some property as executor of the will of Joan Granlyng, and in 1552 he was executor to John Nettylton of Sudbourne. He was one of the burgesses of Orford who, with the two churchwardens, sold one of the church bells to Thomas How of London in 1540, possibly to help pay for church repairs. He was involved in some litigation concerning the messuages called Cattmers and Caltons in Orford. Arising from a serious dispute as to rights of common, between the inhabitants of Orford and Lord Willoughby of Parham who was lord of the manor, Lord Willoughby sued Robert Pawling for arrest of goods. Robert Buckle's warning to him against meddling is perhaps not so surprising.

His executor was his brother-in-law, James Aldham, and as supervisor he appointed John Haffin (Haughfen), Lord of the Manor of Russells in Chillesford, who was nephew to Thomas Manning, the last Prior of Butley, who became Bishop of Ipswich after the closure of the Priory.
