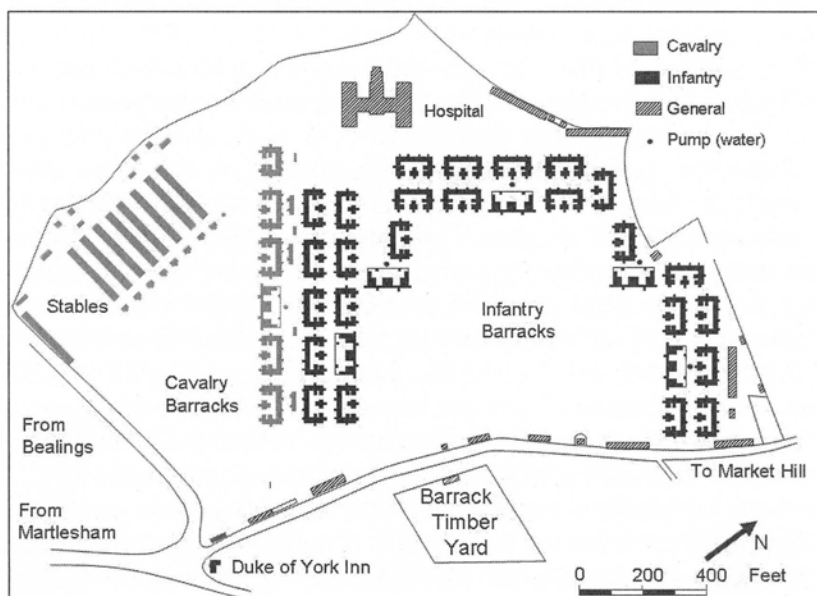


## A Plan of Woodbridge Barracks

Most regiments stayed for short periods only, sometimes being in transit between other postings. Those that stayed longer than 18 months were the RHA, who were there the whole time from 1803 to 1814, the 54th Regiment of Foot, 2nd German Hussars, Northamptonshire and Berwick Militias, although some of these may have left and then returned.
